Josiah Forty

Josiah Forty was the son of Josiah and Priscilla Forty and he was born in Much Marcle in 1879. At the 1881 census he was living with his grandmother Adeline England at Bounds Pitch. In 1891 Josiah senior is a labourer on a farm and the family were living at Baynham, Yatton. Josiah married Charlotte Johns in 1897 and in 1901 they were living with their two children in Llangarren Ross. Josiah was a waggoner on a farm. By 1911 they had seven children they were living in Redlands, Much Marcle. Josiah enlisted in the Herefordshire Regiment and was later transferred to the 423rd Agricultural Coy. Labour Corps. He died at the depot at Atcham, Shrewsbury in February 1918. He is buried in Much Marcle churchyard.
